A Massachusetts learners permit is required for minors who want to get their drivers license. To get this drivers permit in Massachusetts, you need to be at least 16 years of age. As well, you will need to successfully pass two tests and get the consent of a parent or other eligible adult. Once you are eligible, you will then need to submit an application and present a minimum of three documents to the DMV. Whether you choose to submit three or four documents will depend on whether or not you want to use your permit as a form of federal identification. You can only get the DMV learners permit in Massachusetts when you have successfully completed both a written test and a skills test. Massachusetts Learners Permit Eligibility Guidelines Drivers permit requirements in Massachusetts state that you must be at least 16 years old in order to get your permit. To get a learning license, you also need to complete a 48-hour driving course. This includes 18 hours of road experience. You also need to be a resident of Massachusetts who is legally allowed to be in the US, and you need to get the consent of an adult. This adult will usually be your parent or guardian, but The Department of Children and Families is also allowed to issue this consent. If you are attending a boarding school, your headmaster has the ability to sign consent. Guardians, headmasters and representatives from the Department of Children and Families need to provide documentation proving their relationship with the minor. How to Apply for a Learners Permit in Massachusetts If you are wondering how to get your driving permit online in Massachusetts, the answer is simple: you cannot. Though you are able to renew licenses online, you must apply for a learner permit in person, because the DMV needs to review your documents and administer several tests. This is the same reason why, when determining where to get a learners permit, you must go to a DMV office. Though AAA locations offer many drivers learners permit and license services, they are not allowed to accept applications from a resident getting their first permit or license. Before getting a learners permit in Massachusetts at a DMV office, though, you may complete the application online. This application will require you to provide basic information about yourself, such as your name and Social Security Number. You will then need to bring a minimum of three documents to the DMV. These documents will need to prove: Your legal authorization to be in the US. This is most commonly done with a valid U.S. passport or birth certificate, though you may also use a Permanent Resident card or a document proving temporary residency privileges. Your Social Security Number. This is most commonly done with a Social Security Card. 1099, W-2 or an SSN Denial Notice, but you may also use a pay stub if it shows both your legal name and your Social Security Number. Your Massachusetts residency. This is most commonly done with insurance policies, bills, school correspondence or financial correspondence, though government-issued documentation may also be used if it shows your name and address. The above steps are for applying for a permit card that is not REAL ID compliant. This means you will be able to use it to drive. However, it will not be suitable for federal identification. If you want to use your learners permit for federal identification purposes, like if you are boarding a domestic flight, you will need to provide three of the documents listed above, plus a second document proving your residency. The Massachusetts Drivers Permit Test The Massachusetts DMV permit test requires you to answer 25 questions. You only pass the test if you get 72% of the questions right, meaning you must get at least 18 of the questions correct. The questions will cover road rules, road signs and the restrictions placed on minors while driving with a permit. This learners permit test may be retaken if you do not pass it, but you will need to pay \$30 for each retake. You cannot take an online drivers permit test in Massachusetts, because the Department needs to ensure that you are completing the test by yourself. This means it must be taken at a DMV location. When determining what to bring to a permit test in Massachusetts, you may want to bring a Driver's Manual so that you may study the material before taking the exam. The only requirement is that you must bring a form of identification. There is not a Massachusetts DMV practice permit test provided by the state, though the Driver's Manual covers all of the information. You can also find a practice test online from a third party provider. Massachusetts Driving Permit Rules and Restrictions Driving permit rules in Massachusetts are designed to ensure that minors learn how to drive in a safe environment. For this reason, permit driving hours are from 5 a.m. to midnight. There are no exceptions. Below you will find some questions that are frequently asked about rules: Can you drive with a permit in Massachusetts if your passenger is between the ages of 18 and 20? No, your passenger must be at least 21 years of age, and they must have held their license for at least a year. Can you drive with a passenger who has lost his or her privileges? Your passenger must currently have driving privileges in order to supervise your driving. How long does a learner's permit last in Massachusetts? The permit is valid for two years, though you only need it for a minimum of six months; you will be able to convert it to a license once you have driven with your permit for 40 hours and you have successfully passed the skills test. Massachusetts Learner Permit Fees: The learner permit fee is the same for all applicants, though this cost does not include the cost of the skills test. The permit price in Massachusetts is \$30. This includes the cost of the written test, but retakes cost an additional \$30. The skills test exam costs \$35. Discounts are not provided if you need to take the exam again. Headed downhill, turn your front wheels into the curb or toward the side of the road. Set the parking brake. Remember, when you park on a hill, the general rule is to turn your wheels sharply toward the side of the road or curb. This way, if your vehicle starts to roll downhill, it will roll away from traffic. However, when headed uphill at a curb, you should turn the front wheels in the opposite direction, away from the curb and towards the road. You'll need to answer 18 questions correctly within the allotted 25 minutes. The allotted time is usually more than enough to pass the examination. If you have a cognitive or physical disability that prevents you from finishing a test within 25 minutes, you may request an alternative test with extended time. There may also be an opportunity to ask for a paper or person-to-person oral exam. When you practice with these sample tests, it is a good idea to aim higher than 18 correct answers, and it is best if you stay at it until you reach a score of 100 percent on each test. That way, you can feel confident that you will pass the examination. Topics covered on the real permit exam include effects of alcohol and drugs, license suspensions, and JOL restrictions and violations . You must also know common rules of the roads, traffic lights , pavement markings , and road signs. Make sure you fully understand these topics. When you apply for your first license, you must always start with a MA learner's permit, regardless of age. If your suspension period is two years or more, you must take a complete exam (learner's permit exam and road test) to reinstate your suspended/revoked learner's permit or driver's license. Even if your suspension period is less than two years, an RMV hearings officer may decide that you must take both the knowledge exam and the road test again. If you let your license expire for more than a year, RMV will ask you to retake all tests. You must take all tests if you hold an expired license from Canada, Mexico, or the US Territories and that license expired more than a year ago. Suppose the license is valid or expired less than a year ago. In that case, you must provide a certified driving record (30 days old or less) from the country or territory. You must also have a valid immigration status for at least 12 months. In such a case, RMV waives the knowledge and road tests. If you have a valid license from another country, RMV will require you to take all tests. Exceptions exist for licenses from France, Germany, South Korea, and Taiwan. Read more: Information for converting certain foreign driver's licenses Applicants with a valid license from any other state, District of Columbia, U.S. territory, Canada, or Mexico can transfer their driver's license to a Massachusetts license without taking the test. Their license must be valid or expired less than a year ago. All RMV branches offer computer-based testing stations. Learner's permit exams can also be taken online at Mass.Gov/RMV after visiting a service center. The automated tests are available in the following languages: Audio support is also available. You change your language setting when you start the test. You can skip questions during the test if unsure about the answer. You can skip up to 7 questions. If you don't reach the passing score (18 correct answers), the skipped questions will return at the end of the test. If you already have a passing score, the skipped questions will not return. Suppose you have any disability that may prevent you from taking the exam through an automated testing station or from your home. In that case, you may request an alternative extended time, paper, or person-to-person oral exam. Person-to-person oral exams are currently only available in English and may only be available at some centers. Test questions usually have four choices; read all of them carefully. Unlike the actual test, these practice tests typically have three options. When applying for your first permit, you must start the application online . RMV will then inform you to bring required documents and completed application to a RMV Service Center . If you aren't a US citizen, you must show proof of your legal presence with a green card or VISA documents. Please ensure you have all the necessary documents to avoid additional hassle at the service center. If you fail the online test at home, you will get instructions on paying for it and taking a new test online at the end of the exam. If you fail the test at a service center, you can also re-test the same day, but these tests may be subject to availability. If you want to visit the service center, you should make an appointment. You can make it online if you like. As mentioned, online tests and tests at a service center have a time limit. You have 25 minutes to complete the test. If you feel that 25 minutes isn't enough, you can rest assured that 25 minutes is usually more than enough. Most test takers finish the test in less than 15 minutes. Remember, if an examiner catches you cheating on an exam, you must wait for 60 days before you can take a re-test. In severe cases of cheating, you may be subject to further investigation and denied a driver's license or learner's permit. Manuals or other reference materials are not allowed in the testing area at a service center or when taking the test at home. Focus on learning everything you need to pass the exam. It is easy; you will feel better and be a safer driver. Even if the passing score on the MA test is among the lowest in the country, the test is challenging, so you must prepare well. Let's start by reading the MA Driver's Manual. You will find everything you need to learn in this manual. An active learning strategy with practice tests, driver education classes, and sharing experiences with others will also help you. If you pass the knowledge test, your score is valid for six months, and you must complete your road test within these six months. With the learner's permit, you can start practicing driving. When you practice driving, you must always carry your learner's permit. You must always be accompanied by a licensed driver at least 21 when you are behind the wheel. Your supervising driver must also have at least one year of driving experience and sit beside you. If you are under 18, you may only drive between midnight and 5:00 a.m. if the supervising driver is your parent or legal guardian. After six months and at least 40 hours of supervised driving (30 hours if you completed a driver skills development program), you are ready for your intermediate license, the Massachusetts Junior Operator License (JOL)
