If it has become twisted or kinked, this could prevent the water from draining away completely and stop the door from opening. Whilst checking the drainage hose for twists or blockages also ensure it is no further into the wall pipe than 6 inches (15cm) as any deeper can also prevent correct drainage. The pressure switch detects the amount of water even when it is empty and prevent the door lock from freeing. This is a job for a professional. The temperature sensor detects the water temperature and sends a report to the control board. If the water temperature is too high, the door will not be allowed to open. If you switch the machine off and remove the plug for around 10 to 15 minutes, this might allow the sensor to shut off and then the door should open. You will need an engineer to replace the sensor but at least youll have access to your laundry. The door handle is a simple lever that pulls on the door latch. The latch then removes itself from the door under these circumstances. Just pass a piece of strong string or fishing wire between the door and the machines body. Then pull the string towards you sharply whilst standing on the opposite side to the door catch. On most machines this will open the door catch and replace as necessary. This is usually caused by the thermal lock which should release the door lock around 2 minutes after the wash program has finished. It works by heating up and expanding. This is why the door takes around 2 minutes, the door still wont open, try firmly slapping the door at the catch area with an open palm that should do it. The electronic control board controls everything in your washing machine and sometimes it can cause the door to not open. You will need an engineer to solve this and expect a large bill too because control boards are expensive. If the door wont open and the machine is displaying a fault code, make a note of it and check in your user manual. Fault codes are brand specific too. This means youll need to check the user manual before deciding what action to take next. Most washing machine doors are relatively fragile and so you will need to treat them gently if you dont want to compound the problem even further. If in doubt, contact Beko customer services.Lets take a closer look at each of these issues; The thermal or timed lock is a feature on most modern washing machines which prevents you from opening the door for a few minutes at the end of the cycle. This is absolutely normal and nothing to be concerned about. All you need to do is wait for two to three minutes for the thermal interlock to cool down. You will then be able to open the washer door. The child lock is a safety feature designed to prevent inquisitive little hands from messing with the dials, buttons and controls on your washing machine. In some cases, the child lock symbol (a padlock) or the letters CL. If the child lock has been activated you will not be able to open the door until it is deactivated. Consult your user manual for specific instructions on how to deactivate the child lock on your model. If there has been a power outage or power cut whilst your washer was running, it can cause the door to become stuck in the closed position. All you need to do is wait for the power to be restored and then the door should work as normal. The washing machine will not allow the door to be opened if there is water left in the drum. If there is water left in the drum at the end of the wash cycle, it will most likely be caused by one of the following; This is the most common cause of a washing machine failing to drain properly. The filter is designed to trap anything likely to cause damage to the drain pump. Items like buttons, stray threads, or anything left in the pockets of clothes like; coins, screws, nails, hair pins, hair the floor to collect any water trapped inside. Once the container is full, close the filter, empty the container and repeat until all of the water has been removed using a soft bristled brush (like a toothbrush). In some cases, the drain hose can become twisted or kinked which restricts the flow of water from the drum. The drain cycle eventually times out, leaving some water stuck in the drum. This is detected by the washers sensors and the door will not open as a result. You will need to inspect the drain hose and straighten any kinks or twists. This should solve the problem and allow the water to drain away freely. The door will then open after a short period to allow the interlock to cool down. However, if the drain pump itself is the cause of the problem. You can check on the functionality of the drain pump whilst the filter is removed. Simply turn the impeller by hand (it should move freely) this shows that theres nothing blocking the pump from working. However, other than usual and wont allow you to open the door, the mechanism is probably jammed. This is often caused by the door being misaligned. It is possible to realign the door yourself, but unless you know what youre doing, you could cause more damage. Which is why I recommend contacting a technician to sort this for you. If the door handle feels far looser than normal and it doesnt do anything when operated, it could be because the door bandle or the door catch has broken. You will need to use one of the methods below to open the door before replacing the broken component. The control board on a washing machine governs every function and just like your PC needs to be rebooted every so often. In some cases, all you need to do is perform a reset to clear any problems that the control board is having. To perform a reset on your Beko washing machine all you need to do is; Disconnect The Power SupplyRemove the plug from the circuit breaker to the off position. Allow 10-15 Minutes To PassLeave the plug disconnected or the circuit breaker in the off position for at least 10-15 minutes to allow any residual power to discharge. Reconnect The Power SupplyOnce the electrical charge has been dissipated, plug the washer will now have been removed. The washer has been reset and the door should now work correctly again. However, if there is a genuine fault with the control board, the reset will not have solved the problem and the door will probably not open. If this is the case, you will need to contact a technician to diagnose and probably replace the control board. Now that we have some idea of the reasons why the door on your Beko washing machine wont open, lets have a look at the ways to solve this issue. Many people assume that as soon as the cycle ends, the door on the washing machine should open. However, modern Beko washers have a LED light next to the End/Cancel button. Once the cycle has finished, the Ready light flashes for a few seconds before the End light comes on and stays on. Only then has the cycle actually completed. The door will not open until the Ready light has finished flashing and this can take upwards of two or more minutes. You should also turn the dial to the Off position (typically with the black line pointing straight up). Then, once the Ready light stops flashing the door lock should release.
