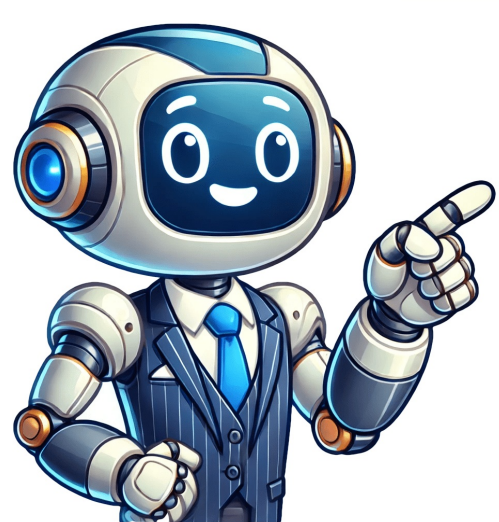

Dyson says you can also do this in the sink, but you might not want to risk dust going down the plughole where it could cause a blockage. This step can release a lot of dust into the air, so if you suffer from allergies, or want to keep the mess to a minimum, you might want to do this outside.STEP 3Now rise the open end(s) of the filter under warm running water - or cold water if that's what the user manual of your particular model specifies - turning it to allow the water to flow through and over the mesh from different angles. You can gently rub the filter with your fingers or use a soft, bristled brush to gently scrub dust away.Stick to just plain water for cleaning your filter - do not use any detergents. STEP 4Once clean, fill the filter with water, covering the ends with your palms to contain it. Hold it horizontally over the sink and give it a shake to dislodge any final bits of debris. Repeat this step, filling it up and shaking it until the water runs clear.STEP 5Extract as much residual water as you can by shaking the wet filter over the sink. Hold it upright so the water drips down and out. Continue to shake it gently until it stops dripping.STEP 6Finally, place the filter in its plastic end with the mesh upwards and leave it to dry for at least 24 hours in a warm spot with lots of ventilation (near an open window, for example). These filters can't be dried in the tumble dryer, microwave, or near a naked flame. Feel the filter to double check it's completely dry before refitting, otherwise you risk damaging the appliance. And that's it, your Dyson vacuum should run like new again.How to clean the filter for Dyson V6, V7 and V8The rules are similar, but not identical for these models. The Dyson V7 features one longer filter taken from above the canister. It should be tapped to remove excess dust and then rinsed with cold water, letting the water flow both inside and out, before squeezing the filter by hand to remove the moisture. You can also twist it with both hands to bring out the remaining droplets. Again, leave this filter upright for at least 24 hours to dry thoroughly. The Dyson V6 and V8, on the other hand, contain two filters, each of which will need to be cleaned. For the longer filter removed from the canister, you can follow the general directions above, tapping to remove the excess debris and rinsing under the tap with cold water. You can also squeeze and twist it, as mentioned for the V8, to remove the residual water. For the secondary filter at the end of the vacuum, this simply means rinsing and tapping under cold running water, until the water runs clear. Then shake and dry as described in the main steps. If the water doesn't run clear at first, keep rinsing the filter. 7 ways to make your bedroom smell freshWhat to do with a smelly Dyson filter?Unfortunately, Dyson filters can start to smell over time - even after they've been washed - which can leave unpleasant odours in your home after vacuuming. Because you can't use detergents to clean Dyson filters, you can't remove or mask the scent effectively, but you can try to stop the smell from forming in the first place. It may be a consequence of the drying process. The longer something takes to dry, the more opportunity bacteria has to develop and the mustier it can smell. Try to speed up the drying process by placing your freshly washed filter near to an open window or in another well-ventilated space. Rotate it and shake it occasionally to give it a helping hand. A warm environment can help speed things along too. If this doesn't help, it might be time to buy a replacement filter, which are available on Dyson's website. Lawson McLean explains that Dyson filters utilize unique multi-cyclone technology. "Up to 18 cyclones are configured to provide optimal performance," he says. "The diameter of each cyclone is carefully balanced with the space between them to maintain the velocity required to remove fine dust from the airflow." Simply unscrew it then remove the filter.The pre-motor filter in a cordless Dyson can't be removed and should be cleaned by accessing the dustbin and cleaning with a soft brush, such as the Mr. Siga Cleaning Brush Set, available at Amazon.
