On the Printer Options screen, use a pinch-out (zoom in) gesture on the photo preview. This magically creates a PDF preview. Tap the Share icon again (top right). Choose Save to Files, AirDrop, Mail, or any sharing option. Tip: You can select multiple photos to combine them into a single image: Open the Files app and find your image. Long-press the file, tap Quick Actions, then Create PDF. For multiple images: In Files, tap the More (...) button, then Select. Choose all images you want. Special Tips When converting multiple photos, the Files app arranges them in an alphabetical or numerical order in the PDF. So, rename the photos accordingly. After the PDF is created, you can easily add or delete pages/images from the PDF file. A key benefit of using the Notes app to convert images into a PDF is that you can add text to the PDF-like image titles, captions, descriptions, etc. You can also use Markup tools to draw, add signatures, and more. While the iPhone can easily convert multiple images in a stylized format, use third-party apps or websites like Canva or iLovePDF. There are many situations when you might want to convert photos or images you have on your iPhone or iPad to PDF documents. You can do this using the Photos app, but it isn't really obvious how to do it. There is no option to convert images into PDF in the Photos app. Fortunately, it isn't difficult either. We'll tell you how to convert a photo to a PDF on iPhone or iPad. If you check the image file extensions in Photos, they are usually PNG, GIF, JPEG or HEIF. From your iPhone or iPad, you can use the share/print function in Photos, the Files app or the Books app as a PDF converter. I explain the three methods below; you can choose whichever is easier for you. Use the Print function to create a PDF from a photo Open the Photos app on your iPhone or iPad. Transforming a picture into a PDF on your iPhone is surprisingly straightforward, thanks to one built-in iOS feature that's also available on iPadOS. All iPhones running iPadOS 13 and newer (the same goes for iPads running iPadOS 13 and newer) come with the Shortcuts app. This app lets you automate a ton of stuff on your iPhone, including the picture-to-PDF conversion. There's no need to create a custom shortcut from scratch - there's already one created by Apple in the Gallery tab, and search for "PDF." Tap the + icon to install the shortcut. Open the photo (or photos) you want to convert in the Photos app, tap the Share icon, then scroll down and tap the Make PDF option. Your photo will transform into a PDF to share or save to your device. If you're looking for more control and features when turning your pictures into PDFs, third-party apps are the way to go. There's a whole world of apps for this, each with its own set of bells and whistles. JPG to PDF conversion performed using iLovePDF For quick conversions, Webbased apps like JPG to PDF and iLovePDF are super handy. They run directly in your browser, so you don't even need to download anything. Just upload your photo, and it gets converted online. However, if you're dealing with sensitive images, think twice, as these conversions happen on a remote server, so it's not the most secure route for your private photos. When privacy matters, or when you're after extra features, iOS apps from the App Store are your best bet. My favorite image-to-PDF-iOS converter app is PDFGenius. It can convert, split, merge, compress, password-protect, and much more. limitations of the free version.
