# When is it best to plant tulip bulbs

What is the best month to plant tulip bulbs. What month should you plant tulip bulbs. What is the best time of year to plant tulip bulbs.

Most of the flowers that define the "spring garden" come from bulbs, which are essentially large fatty seeds. If you could choose a preferred autumn task, I should put these beauties in the ground, including my tulips, daffodils, allium and snowdrops. During the winter, bulbs take advantage of the cold climate to develop their radical devices, in order to break into life the next spring. Rather than limiting yourself to the only period of the year, I find that it is a better indicator to pay attention to the evening temperatures and the ground conditions when planting the bulbs.idally, night temperatures should go below 5-10 ° C, and the Land should be hot enough to work. Once the temperatures reach that threshold, you are free to plant. That said, life happens. It is easy to get involved in the care of the autumnal lawn and other responsibilities and lose the ideal window to plant. My advice if you already bought your bulbs is to plant them anyway. As long as you can work the ground, it is better in the ground than in the package. Most of the species sold in our area are rather hard, so if you plant considerable drifts, you have a good chance to get a decent turnout in spring. If the ground is completely frozen, you are not yet hopeless! Plant them in large containers and keep them in a sheltered, but not heated area, like a shed or garage. Give them a monthly water drink and take them out in the spring. At that point, you can choose to transplant them in the garden or let them flourish in your containers. For all the species listed below, choose a well drained soil and aim for a soil acidity of 6 or 7 for the bestThe practical rules to remember are to plant at a depth of about 2-3 times the height of the bulb and to water abundantly after sowing.Tulips: Plant drifting tulips 15-20 cm apart.All tulips are planted in autumn, but there are some that bloom in early spring (early May), mid-spring (mid-late May) and late May), and late spring (late May to early June). Bulbs can be planted by touching them there are no things like too close, you get the best show when you pamper them together.It's Crocus: There are autumn crocus and spring crocus, which can be a bit confusing when you look at the planting times. In autumn, you're looking to plant spring-flowering crochets, which could simply be labeled "crochets". Plant drifting coconut bulbs 5-15 cm apart In large groups they look stunning. Snowdrop: Also known as Galanthus, these white flowers nod and blossom early here in Guelfo, along with crochi as early as March. Plant them in groups spaced 5-7.5 cm apart.Daffodil: Daffodils are also called Narcissus, which you will want to look for if you want to plant varieties other than the classic lemon yellow. Narcissus varieties may vary in the amount of space they require, but they all work best if you plant a little earlier than most bulbs. Try to have them buried by mid-October.Hyacinth: a delight for the senses, hyacinths are known for their powerful fragrance and their beautiful bouquets of flowers. In autumn, the hyacinth bulbs should be planted with the pointed end facing upwards and spaced 10 cm apart. They perform best in areas with full or partial sun. During the spring flowering period, hyacinths produce amazing cut flowers.Eranthis: Together with the snowdrops, these were the first flowers in your garden to bloom in spring. It's not uncommon for them to peek out of the last waves of snow! The teacup-shaped yellow blossoms are beautiful in large groups spaced about 5 cm apart.Fritillaria: Also known as Crown Imperial, these bell-shaped beauties have a unique presence in the spring garden. Plant 15-30 cm deep in full sun and 20-23 cm apart. Their fragrance also helps repel insects and squirrels in the garden!Allium: Sometimes called an ornamental onion, the spectacular globe-shaped blooms on a straight stem make a big effect from late spring to early summer. In addition, they are another key element in repelling insects and squirrels (again, it's an onion!). Place them 5-20 cm apart, depending on the size of the bulb. Space bulbs come out about twice as much as their bulbs from parasitesYou're not the only one with a plan for those big, beautiful light bulbs! Many creatures love bulbs as a source of food during the fall, so it is advisable to plan for scavengers.At the time of sowing, bulbs work best when their soil is enriched with nutrient-dense organic fertilizers. In our garden center, we bring chicken manure and blood meal, blood, Both make excellent accompaniments for your bulbs. Not only the bulbs thrive on their nutrients, but even the smell of both fertilizers is deterrent for squirrels and chips. The daffodils are generally not worshiped by the squirrels (some of the most known bulb thieves), then planting them abundantly around other varieties can deter squirts to tear the garden. Some gardeners have luck with the placing of chicken wire over their freshly planted size to create a physical barrier between the parasites and the plant. Also the plug of the ground to cover the scent of the bulbs helps, like the layer on mulching fabric and / or crushing. Tulips are probably the larger goal for parasites, so if you can only protect a plant, protect those tulips! By now, the sun is coming first and the days feel more short every day. Or maybe you didn't have the chance to stop at the center of the garden this fall, and you are worried that spring, your landscape will be boring, colorless, and lacks beautiful tulips, crocus, daffodils, and allium! We have good news for you. It's never too late to plant bulbs. (Yes, really!) All you need is to know the best tips and tricks to make these spring beauties flourish. The best time to plant the spring light bulbs ideally, you want to plant bulbs in the fall, when the land is still soft and workable. The fact is that you don't want to plan them too early in the season. Planting the light bulbs too soon can leave them susceptible to rot. If you put them on the ground at the end of August or early September, they could also be deceived to think of its spring, and try to flourish! If you plant too soon, they will not flow when they should. Spring flowering light bulbs need time to cool down before spring to flourish. The best time to plant spring flower light bulbs is late autumn. This gives them time to relax before spring. But what if you lost the boat at the best time to plant bulbs? Can you still plan them in November, December and beyond? Vegetable bulbs in winter for subsequent flowers after the first frost or snowstorm, one could assume that the days of bulb-crying are finished. But until the ground is working, you can plant bulbs! Don't let the snow scare you from planting bulbs. you can brush away the snow and dig "the ground is frozen only on the surface". Can't you plant the bulbs immediately after you buy them? store them in a cool and dry place. immersing them in water will prevent them from drying out.
