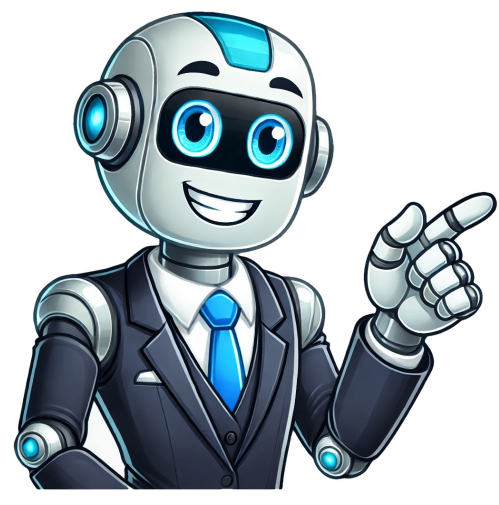

According to Star Wars lore, a Padawan, or Jedi apprentice, is a trainee who one day will become a Jedi Knight or master. Padawans receive one-on-one instruction in the ways of the Jedi. When a Padawan's training is completed, he must pass the Trials to become a Jedi knight. Padawan means "learner" in Sanskrit. The term made its first appearance in "Star Wars: Episode I: The Phantom Menace," with Obi-Wan Kenobi as the padawan to Master Qui-Gon Jinn. In turn, Anakin Skywalker became padawan to Jedi Master Obi-Wan Kenobi. During the timeframe of the Star Wars movies, padawans usually had short hair but were single braids on the right side, which were cut off with a lightsaber when they passed their Trials and became Jedi Knights. Padawans were typical Jedi robes. In the Star Wars universe, some individuals are more sensitive to the Force than others. Force-sensitive individuals can be identified by the number of mid-chlorians in their blood and by certain talents such as faster reflexes (owing by an ability to foresee the immediate future). Jedi younglings are selected on the basis of their midi-chlorian levels and talents; not all younglings, however, become padawans. In the early history of the Jedi, Jedi Masters could teach more than one apprentice at once. After the Jedi Order became more unified and centralized, around 4,000 BBY, the High Council established rules for training apprentices, who became known as padawans. A Jedi master could not take more than one padawan at a time, and potential padawans had to be under a certain age to be trained. At that time, the annual Apprenticeship Tournament was held at the Jedi Temple on Coruscant, which was an opportunity for the Force to direct the choice of potential padawans. The tournament was held every year, and it was a test of strength, speed, and agility. The winner of the tournament would be chosen as the next apprentice. The tournament was also a way for the Force to select the most talented younglings to become padawans. Some were not chosen and instead joined the Jedi Service Corps. Padawans typically wore single braids (or equivalent jewelry for species without hair) to identify themselves from other Force-sensitives. They trained with their masters for about a decade before being expected to obey their masters in everything as they learned and grew in the Force. They could still take courses at the Temple as they desired if their master was agreeable. During their apprenticeship, padawans learned to use the Force as a sense. They also studied how to construct a lightsaber and traveled to Ilum to enter a trance and build their lightsabers, which became one of their few possessions as Jedi. If they passed the Jedi Trials, they became Jedi Knights. Generally, training an apprentice to knighthood was a requirement for becoming a Jedi master. When Luke Skywalker re-established the Jedi Order after the Jedi Purge, there were not fully enough trained Jedi for the master-padawan system. Instead, Luke set up a Jedi Academy and trained many students, much like the Jedi of old. One-on-one apprenticeships existed but were generally informal and impermanent. Later on, Luke's son Ben became a padawan to restore some of the padawan traditions to the New Jedi Order, such as the padawan braid. "Yes! A Jedi's strength flows from the Force. But beware of the dark side." Yoda[1] Force-sensitive beings were brought to the Jedi Temple on Coruscant, where they learned the ways of the Force as members of the Jedi Order. Jedi training was the action of teaching an apprentice the ways of the Force in the Jedi Order. Under the Galactic Republic, Force-sensitive beings were brought to the Jedi Temple on Coruscant from across the galaxy and trained as Jedi younglings by Grand Master Yoda. The younglings advanced to the next stage of their training as the Padawan of either a Jedi Master or the lesser ranked Jedi Knight. If they passed the Jedi Trials, the Padawan would ascend to the full status of a Jedi Knight, and therefore, be considered a Jedi Master. However, a few Jedi managed to survive the Great Jedi Purge, such as Cal Kestis, who served as the Padawan of Jedi General Jarro Tapal during the Clone Wars. After befriending another former Jedi, Cere Junda, Kestis set out to rebuild his Order by finding Force-sensitive children whom he could train as the next generation of Jedi. However, due to the threat that the Empire posed to their safety, Kestis ultimately abandoned this mission, believing the children's destinies should be trusted to the Force. But over the course of his journey, Kestis was able to reclaim the Jedi arts and complete his training, by which time he was knighted by Junda, who also reconnected with her Jedi heritage.[3]Kanan Jarrus, another former Padawan who survived Order 66, found his own student: Ezra Bridger, an orphan whose latent Force-sensitivity made him a candidate for Jedi training.[22] Despite his initial attempts to train Bridger, Jarrus did not feel suitable as a mentor, having never completed his own training. He set out to rescue Jedi Master Luminara Unduli after discovering that she might have survived the Purge, believing she would be a better teacher for Bridger. Ultimately, the rumor was a trap to lure fugitive Jedi to the Grand Inquisitor.[23] Jarrus redoubled his efforts to properly train Bridger, but at one point his apprentice demonstrated potential with the dark side. Concerned by Bridger's ability to harness the dark side, Jarrus warned him to not lose control of his emotions.[24] Although he was reaching the age of nine hundred, Yoda worked to train Luke Skywalker on Dagobah. Approximately two decades after the Galactic Empire rose to power, Luke Skywalker embarked on a journey to become a Jedi Knight like his father before him. He was initially trained by Anakin Skywalker's former Master, Obi-Wan Kenobi, who taught Luke how to sense the Force through his feelings. However, their time together as Master and apprentice was cut short by Kenobi's death at the hands of the Sith Lord Darth Vader,[21] forcing the young Skywalker to continue his Jedi training alone. After communicating with the Force spirit of Kenobi, Skywalker traveled to Dagobah, where he discovered Yoda, the ancient Grand Master of the Jedi Order.[1] But Yoda was initially discouraged by Skywalker's attitude, seeing much of Anakin's impatience and anger in Luke. After some consideration and Kenobi's endorsement, Yoda chose to overlook Skywalker's age as well as his penchant for adventure and excitement in order to complete his training.[8]Skywalker and Yoda were often at odds throughout their time together, with the latter trying to teach his apprentice to be calm and in control of his developing Jedi abilities. Yet Skywalker remained reckless, cutting short his training to confront Darth Vader. As a result, he suffered an agonizing defeat in battle against the Dark Lord of the Sith, who revealed his former identity as the boy's father, Anakin Skywalker. By the time Luke returned to Dagobah to finish his Jedi training, Yoda had become ill and was on the verge of becoming one with the Force. In addition to a dozen other students, Skywalker trained his nephew Ben in the Jedi arts[32] on Ossus.[30] Like his uncle and grandfather, Solo was naturally gifted in the ways of the Force, possessing raw strength[32] and the potential for limitless power.[33] As Ben[30] and the other initial students[34] grew older, new younglings came into the temple's care, with individuals like Enyo and the now-Padawan Solo helping Skywalker in passing down the Order's teachings.[30] It was in Solo that Skywalker placed his hopes for the future of the Jedi Order, and for a time he believed that he would not die as the last Jedi.[32] However, Skywalker's plans fell to ruin due to the machinations of[33] the secretly still-alive Palpatine[35] and his puppet,[28] Supreme Leader Snoke, who converted Solo to the dark side, which resulted in the destruction of Skywalker's new generation of Jedi.[33]Rejecting his mandate to rebuild the Jedi Order, Skywalker resolved to die in exile as the last of the Jedi, until he was located on Ach-To by Rey, a scavenger from Jakku. Yet Skywalker had no intention of leaving his hermitage to help the Resistance in its war against the First Order, much less training another generation of Jedi. Rey's persistence eventually won Skywalker down, however. Condensing Jedi training into three lessons, he agreed to teach Rey the ways of the Force. Members of the Jedi Order trained in the ways of the Force.[3] The training of each Jedi varied, depending on their Master. Masters' styles ranged from the maverick Qui-Gon Jinn,[4] to the emotionally driven Anakin Skywalker,[5] to more traditional Jedi such as Obi-Wan Kenobi,[6] Mace Windu,[7] and Grand Master Yoda.[8] Subjects taught included advanced tuition in other disciplines such as: military history,[9] diplomacy, science,[10] investigation,[11] ancient history,[12] and medical science.[13] Dueling was widely considered to be the best training for Padawans, although it was fairly impractical since Jedi were the only ones wielding lightsabers during the Republic.[12]They were also trained in resistance to mind probes and interrogation.[14]During the Clone Wars, Padawans were given additional training to make competent commanders of the Republic military under a Jedi General due to the Galactic Republic's lack of military leaders.[15]Overall, every Jedi was duty-bound to observe the tenets of the Jedi Code, one of which forbade the Jedi from training more than one apprentice at a time. As Jedi, they were trained to rely only on the light side for power, to disregard accolades and resist other temptations of the dark side of the Force.[16][17]History[Age of the Jedi]"Anakin, training to be a Jedi isn't an easy challenge. During the reign of the Galactic Republic, Force-sensitive beings were identified by their midi-chlorian levels and ultimately taken to the Core World Coruscant to begin their training in the Jedi Temple.[16] Training began at the level of the Jedi younglings, who studied in clans consisting of twenty initiates. Together, the younglings were taken to the distant world of Ilum where they could acquire a kyber crystal as part of a rite of passage known as the Gathering, after which they would craft their lightsabers using the crystal as its power source.[18]Following the Initiate Trials, a youngling had to be chosen as an apprentice, formally known as Padawan, in order to advance to the next stage in their path to becoming a full member of the Jedi Order.[19] Those who held the rank of Jedi Knight were tasked with mentoring the next generation of Jedi, while the elder members, known as Jedi Masters, were also free to select a Padawan at their leisure.[20] After further honing their skills in lightsaber combat and various Force techniques, a Padawan could undertake the Jedi Trials[19] once deemed ready by the Jedi High Council. For those who passed their final tests, the title of Jedi Knight was conferred upon them by the Council.[16]Dark times[]"There's nothing for me here now. Padawan Bell Zettifar and his master, Loden Greatstorm, were stationed at the Elphrona Outpost. When they were meant to be rotated back to the capital of Coruscant, Supreme Chancellor Lina Soh established a hyperspace blockade due to the Emergences, forcing the two Jedi to stay on Elphrona for some time. During the Nihil pirates' raid on Elphrona, Greatstorm informed his apprentice that he was worthy of the title of Jedi Knight, butafter Greatstorm was captured by the NihilZettifar refused to go through the Jedi Trials until he was rescued, wanting his mentor to attend the ceremony.[16] In the aftermath of the Battle of Grizal, during which the Eye of the Nihil Marchion Ro unleashed the Great Leveler, which turned Greatstorm to stone and left other Jedi on the battlefield, including Zettifar, mortified,[12] Jedi Padawans were asked to step up and help the Jedi Order in whatever way they could, just like the more experienced Knights and Jedi Masters. As such, a number of Padawans aboard the Starlight Beacon left to help defend the Jedi Temple of the planet Takodana from a Nihil jattack.[18]The stress of battles against the Nihil led to Masters Torban Buck and Kantam Sy re-establishing the "Great Jedi Rumble Race" for the Padawans of Starlight Beacon.[19] As the conflict carried on, Padawan Ram Jomaram found that masters were more willing to have their apprentices learn by "doing" and reasoned the previous generation of Jedi had not had the chance to take on as much duty as current Padawans needed to. He theorized to fellow Padawan Reath Silas that their mentors wanted the new generation to have an easier time during missions. Indeed, Silas's master, Cohmac Vitus, reflected to Sy that fighting dangers across the war-torn Galactic Frontier was not the life the two of them had been raised for.[20]Fall of the Jedi[]"Master Yoda, I gave Qui-Gon my word, I will train Anakin. Your apprentice Skywalker will be."Obi-Wan Kenobi and Yoda[1] During the Clone Wars, Padawans served in the Grand Army of the Republic as Jedi Commanders. During the Clone Wars, the Jedi High Council began to assign Padawans to Jedi Knights, instead of allowing them to choose.[13] During the war, Padawans were trained in combat and forged into officers[21] of the Republic Military partly because of a lack of military leaders. Padawans held the rank of Jedi Commander and could lead forces of clone troopers as large as a regiment.[22] This led to cases where young and inexperienced Padawans, many of them still teenagers, outranked clone troopers with far more experience in combat. At the end of the conflict, in 19 BBY, Supreme Chancellor Sheev Palpatine, secretly the Sith Lord Darth Sidious, issued Clone Protocol 66,[23] forcing[24] the troopers to turn on their Jedi Generals and Commanders.[23]After the establishment of the Galactic Empire, a few ex-Padawans that had survived Order 66 or left the Jedi Order before the purge joined the nascent Rebel Alliance.[25] This was the case of Anakin Skywalker's former apprentice, Ahsoka Tano,[26] as well as Depa Billaba's former apprentice Caleb Dume,[27] who became known as Kanan Jarrus[28] and later took on a Padawan of his own, Ezra Bridger.[29] By 0 BBY, Luke Skywalker, the son of Anakin Skywalker, began training under Jedi Masters Obi-Wan Kenobi[30] and later Yoda.[31]Rebirth[]"Pass on what you have learned. That is the true burden of all masters."Yoda, to Luke Skywalker[32] Luke Skywalker trained Rey as his final Jedi apprentice. Sometime after the Liberation of Lothal, Ahsoka Tano took on Sabine Wren as her Padawan and taught her for a time.[33] After the Battle of Endor in 4 ABY, which saw the deaths of both Emperor Palpatine and his apprentice Darth Vader, Skywalker attempted to rebuild the Jedi Order. However, his new generation of Jedi were killed by his nephew, Ben Solo, who fell to the dark side of the Force. Following this, Skywalker isolated himself to the First Jedi Temple on the Temple Island on the distant planet of Alch-To.[34]In 34 ABY,[35] Rey,[32] a scavenger[34] from Jakku, arrived at the island to enlist him in the Resistance's fight against the First Order, and later became his apprentice. Despite his misgivings about the Jedi Order, Skywalker trained her on the Temple Island and had his faith in the Jedi restored after a conversation with Yoda's Force spirit.[32] Following the Battle of Crait, General Leia Organa introduced Rey to Ambassador Yendor Brethen of Ryloth as Skywalker's apprentice, which greatly impressed Brethen.[36] By the time of the return of Darth Sidious, in 35 ABY,[37] Rey had begun training under Organa on Ajan Kloss, where the Resistance had established a secret base. Using her training, Rey would eventually go on to redeem Ben Solo and defeat Darth Sidious once and for all.[38]Behind the scenes[]The term "Padawan" first written as "Padawaan" appeared as far back in George Lucas's first story treatments for the 1977 film Star Wars: Episode IV A New Hope, then titled as Journal of the Whills.[39] It wasn't heard, however, before the filming of the 1999 film Star Wars: Episode I The Phantom Menace, the first installment of the prequel trilogy.[1] In all previous works, including the original movies or early Star Wars Legends stories, the concept was referred to as "Apprentice."Set after the events of Star Wars: Episode VI Return of the Jedi, the Star Wars: Trials on Tatooine VR experience released by ILMxLAB featured an unidentified hopeful Padawan who hoped to become part of Luke Skywalker's new Jedi Order. In an ensuing mission to Tatooine, however, the Padawan found themself attacked by an Imperial remnant force. Most people know that they're the good guys who use the Force and might even know who some important Jedi are. Read on for a breakdown!The ForceA Jedi is someone who is Force-sensitive, but what is the Force? According to Obi-Wan Kenobi, it's "an energy field created by all living things. . . . It binds the galaxy together." Force-users have access to several extraordinary abilities, such as telekinesis, precognition, and persuasion (more famously known as a Jedi mind trick). In order to master their powers, Force-users undergo training. One organization that provides such training is the Jedi Order.The Jedi OrderThe Jedi Order is a diplomatic organization of Force-users who, before the Galactic Empire's takeover, keep peace in the Galactic Republic. They follow the light side of the Force, which is meant to be used for defense and knowledge rather than aggression. In contrast, their mortal enemies called the Sith look to the dark side for their power. The governmental center of the Jedi Order is the Jedi Temple on the planet Coruscant. There, the Jedi High Council rule the organization, and Force-users can train to harness their abilities and earn the Jedi title.Jedi RanksIn addition to the 12-member Jedi High Council, there are several different ranks among the Jedi Order. Youngling: A youngling is a young, Force-sensitive child undergoing Jedi training. There's an age limit to this training, though, as Anakin Skywalker was initially deemed too old to train despite being just 9 years old when presented to the Jedi High Council. Padawan: When a Jedi Knight or Master chooses a youngling to train and acts as their mentor, the trainee is called a Padawan. Obi-Wan, for example, was Qui-Gon Jinn's Padawan. Knight: After a Padawan is deemed worthy of moving up in the ranks, he or she becomes a Knight. Knighthood is traditionally determined by the successful completion of a series of challenges known as the Jedi Trials. However, some Jedi Knights achieve their titles through grand actions, like Anakin's display of valor during the Clone Wars. Master: A Jedi Knight becomes a Jedi Master after his or her Padawan rises to the Knight rank. Knights can also become Masters if their skill, wisdom, and commitment to the Force lead to an offer of a Jedi High Council seat. Grand Master: The Jedi Grand Master is the leader of the Jedi High Council. The title is given to the oldest and wisest member of the Jedi Order. Before the destruction of the Jedi Order, Yoda has this title. The Future of the JediThe Jedi Order meets a grim fate at the end of the Clone Wars, and eventually, Luke Skywalker (may he RIP) is the last known living Jedi. He tries to train a new generation, but his efforts fail. If more Jedi do come into the fray, will the old traditions still stay the same? Jedi will most likely always be Force-sensitive individuals who follow the light side of the Force. With the ancient Order destroyed, though, maybe some new rules will apply.Star Wars was the original name itself. The first film, when first released, was simply Star Wars, but after the prequel trilogy began being filmed and released, the first film was changed to Episode 4: A New Hope.
