### Desloratadine tablet

#### What is this medicine?

DESLORATADINE is an antihistamine. It relieves the symptoms of hay fever (sneezing, runny nose, and itchy, watery eyes), and may help treat hives and associated itching of the skin.

#### What should I tell my health care provider before I take this medicine?

They need to know if you have any of these conditions:

- asthma
- kidney disease
- liver disease or hepatitis
- an unusual reaction to desloratadine, medicines, foods, dyes, or preservatives
- pregnant or trying to get pregnant
- breast-feeding

#### How should this medicine be used?

Take desloratadine tablets by mouth. This drug may be taken with or without food. Leave the disintegrating tablet in the blister package until you are ready to take it. Peel open the blister pack with dry hands and place the tablet on your tongue. The tablet will dissolve rapidly until it has dissolved completely and can be swallowed. It is not necessary to drink any water to take this medicine; however, you may drink fluids after taking the dose. Take your doses at regular intervals. Do not take your medicine more often than directed.
