Ketoconazole shampoo

What is this product?

Ketoconazole shampoo is used for treating tinea (pityriasis) versicolor. It may also be used for other conditions as determined by your doctor. Ketoconazole shampoo is an imidazole antifungal. It works by preventing the growth of fungus.

What are the contraindications?

Do NOT use ketoconazole shampoo if you are allergic to any ingredient in ketoconazole shampoo.

Contact your doctor or health care provider right away if any of these apply to you.

What should I learn before using ketoconazole shampoo?

Some medical conditions may interact with ketoconazole shampoo. Tell your doctor or pharmacist if you have any medical conditions, especially if any of the following apply to you:

- if you are pregnant, planning to become pregnant, or are breastfeeding
- if you are taking any prescription or nonprescription medicine, herbal preparation, or dietary supplement
- · if you have allergies to medicines, foods, or other substances
- if you have liver problems or the blood disease porphyria
- · if you have a history of alcohol abuse
- Some MEDICINES MAY INTERACT with ketoconazole shampoo.
 Because little, if any, of ketoconazole shampoo is absorbed into the blood, the risk of it interacting with another medicine is low.

Ask your health care provider if ketoconazole shampoo may interact with other medicines that you take. Check with your health care provider before you start, stop, or change the dose of any medicine.
